


How do I mount my screen to a monitor arm?



VESA MOUNTING PLATES

What is a VESA mounting pattern?

A VESA pattern is the layout of the four mounting holes that can be found on the back of your monitor. In a 100 x 100 mm VESA pattern, the screw holes are arranged in a square 100 mm apart. All Zen Space Desks display mounting options use VESA plates and are compatible with 75 x 75 mm and 100 x 100 mm mounting patterns. Please ensure your monitor has the correct mounting pattern prior to purchase.

How do I know what VESA mount I have?

Look for holes on the back of your monitor and measure how far apart they are. Ensure they are arranged in a square and measure equal distance apart.

Do I need to purchase my own screws?

No, all our monitor arms and mounts come with the correct screws for mounting.

What if my monitor does not have a VESA mounting pattern?


All our mounts and arms (except the iMac Arm) use a VESA mounting plate - if your monitor is not VESA compatible, you will be unable to use our product without an adaptor. You will need to check with the manufacturer of your monitor if this is available.

Checking if your monitor mount is VESA compatible

Some monitors may have a covering over the VESA mounting pattern. Be sure to check the back of your monitor thoroughly if you cannot see any holes resembling a VESA mounting pattern.

Handy Tips

- Our monitor arms are designed to be very quick to install. Check out the videos on each product page for a closer look at installation.
- When setting up your monitor arm, it's best to have your screen face down on a towel or blanket to protect your screen from damage.
